#### Rehab/Decon Trailer – Rehab 28

We have a large trailer that was a formally strictly a decon trailer provided by the South Central Task Force. The Trailer has 3 areas. The largest area is the front which we have converted into a rehab area with air condition for summer and heat for the winter. The middle area houses the onboard water tank which is 300 gallons, a large generator, onboard heating system, water heaters, and on board pumps. The last area at the back of the trailer is set up still as 2 decon showers if needed. If this trailer is requested we also have on it EZ-Up tents and 2 portable misting fans. We have also added a salamander heater to pump additional heat in for the winter months. We have (2) 10x20 tents with misting capabilities

#### Small Decon Trailer – Decon 28

This houses the majority of our decon supplies which include the following.

- 5 Pelican portable scene lights
- Decon shower kits

- Large pop up shower
- Generator
- Diesel operated portable hot water heater.
- Large Salamander heater
- Shower Supplies such as soaps,brushes, sprayers,etc
- Trident nozzles

### **Spill/Hazmat Trailer – Special Ops 28**

Our spill/hazmat trailer carries the following equipment.
